



Faculty Position Announcement

Global Health

The Department of Global and Community Health at George Mason University (GMU) invites applications for an open-rank, 9-month, tenure-track or tenured faculty member with expertise in global health, beginning August 2016. Rank of appointment will be commensurate with the candidate's record of scholarly achievement and teaching experience.

The successful candidate will be expected to sustain a robust research program in their area of expertise, publish peer-reviewed articles, seek grant funding, engage in multidisciplinary collaborations, mentor graduate students, teach undergraduate and graduate courses, participate in faculty governance, and assume professional leadership roles at the community, state, and/or national or international level.

The successful candidate will have a doctorate degree in a public health discipline (such as environmental health, epidemiology, global health, health communication, health education, health promotion, or maternal and child health). An MPH is preferred but not required. We seek applicants with experience in comparative global health research and/or experience conducting research in multiple low and/or middle income countries.

GMU is one of the fastest growing universities in the country with a national reputation for innovation in higher education, and its extraordinary diversity of its students. GMU holds a top U.S. News and World Report "Up and Coming" spot for national universities and is recognized for its global appeal and excellence in higher education. It is currently the largest and most diverse university in Virginia with students from all 50 states and over 135 countries studying in 198 degree programs. GMU is located in Fairfax, Virginia and is part of the Washington, D.C. metropolitan area offering easy access to the cultural, scientific, and political resources of the nation's capital.

Founded in 2006, the Department of Global and Community Health offers a B.S. in Community Health, an M.S. in Global Health, and a Council on Education for Public Health accredited MPH with concentrations in Community Health Promotion, Epidemiology, Global Health, and Public Health Communication, enrolling over 450 undergraduate and 100 graduate students. A PhD in public health is underdevelopment. The department comprises 14 full-time faculty members with backgrounds in the social and behavioral sciences, environmental health, epidemiology, and global health who are committed to the ideals of health equity and social justice among underserved domestic and global populations.
